

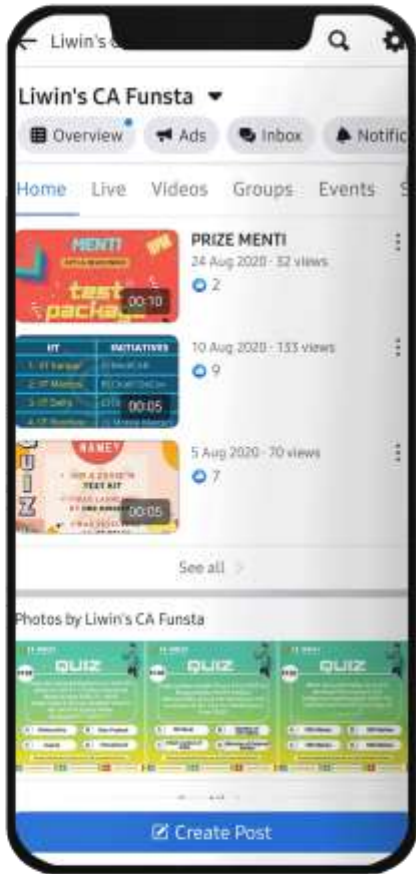

Event and Location:

- **Event:** SEBI fined Jai Anmol Ambani and Krishnan Gopalakrishnan in the Reliance Home Finance case for their failure to adhere to proper procedures in approving loans.
- **Location:** The orders were issued by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI).



Mandates and Objectives:

- **SEBI's Action Against Jai Anmol Ambani:**
 - Jai Anmol Ambani, a non-executive director of Reliance Home Finance, was fined Rs 1 crore by SEBI for failing to exercise due diligence when approving a general-purpose corporate loan (GPCL) of Rs 20 crore.
 - He sanctioned this loan to Accura Productions Private Limited on February 14, 2019, despite clear instructions from the board of directors to refrain from approving any more GPCL loans after their meeting on February 11, 2019.



Mandates and Objectives:

- **Violation of SEBI's LODR Rules:**
 - Both Jai Anmol Ambani and Krishnan Gopalakrishnan, the former Chief Risk Officer of Reliance Home Finance, violated SEBI's Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirement (LODR) rules.
- **Penalties:**
 - Jai Anmol Ambani was fined Rs 1 crore, and Krishnan Gopalakrishnan was fined Rs 15 lakh. Both were ordered to pay the fines within 45 days.
- **SEBI's August Action:**
 - This action follows SEBI's earlier decision in August, where Anil Ambani and 24 others were barred from the securities market for five years due to a related case involving the diversion of Reliance Home Finance Ltd's funds, for which Anil Ambani was fined Rs 25 crore.

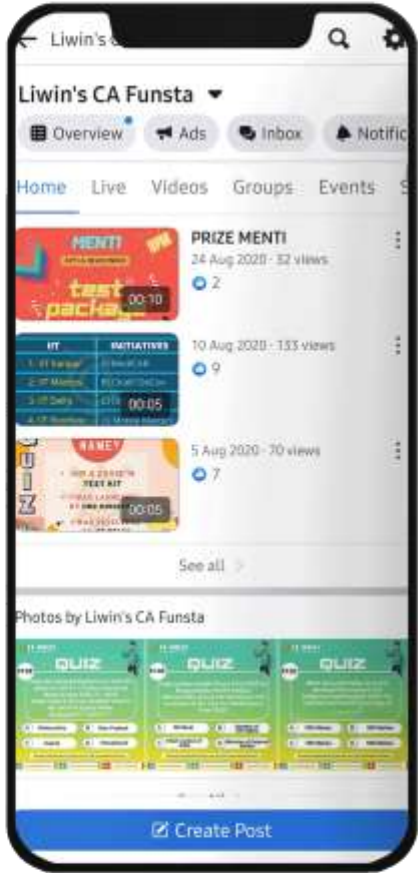

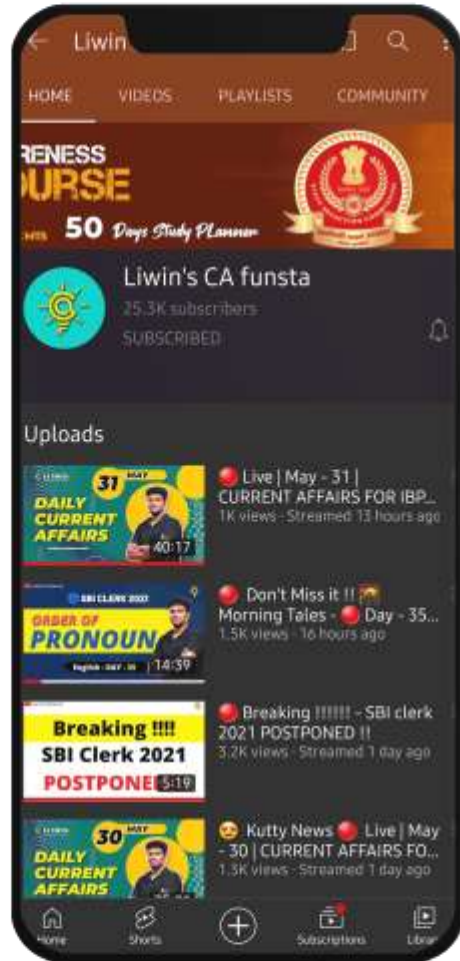

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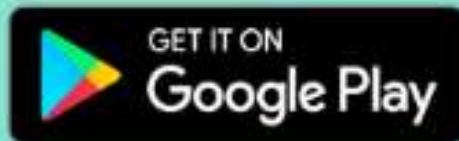
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
